Item Name: Resolution 2025-75. A Resolution by the City Commission of the City of Flagler Beach, Florida, levying the Ad Valorem Property Tax Millage Rate for the municipal purposes on all taxable property within the City for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2025, and ending September 30, 2026, stating the Millage to be levied is 5.4500 in Flagler County and 5.4500 is the rate to be levied for Volusia County; and providing an effective date.

Background:

A Resolution of the City Commission of the City of Flagler Beach, Florida, establishing the ad valorem property tax millage rate for Fiscal Year 2025–26. The millage rate is set at **5.4500 mills** for taxable property in both Flagler County and Volusia County. Adoption of this resolution provides the basis for funding municipal operations in the upcoming fiscal year.

Fiscal Impact:

Adoption of Resolution 2025-75 sets the property tax millage at 5.4500 mills for Fiscal Year 2025–26, generating approximately **\$7.0 million** in revenue. These funds will support general municipal operations for the upcoming fiscal year.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends **adoption of Resolution 2025-75** to establish the Fiscal Year 2025–26 property tax millage rate at 5.4500 mills, ensuring funding for city operations and municipal services.

RESOLUTION 2025-75

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF FLAGLER BEACH, FLORIDA LEVYING THE AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAX MILLAGE RATE FOR MUNICIPAL PURPOSES ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE CITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2025 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2026, STATING THE MILLAGE TO BE LEVIED IS 5.4500 IN FLAGLER COUNTY AND 5.4500 IS THE RATE TO BE LEVIED FOR VOLUSIA COUNTY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Florida law requires the City Commission of the City of Flagler Beach, Flagler/Volusia County, Florida, to pass an ordinance or resolution levying the millage rate for ad valorem property taxes for municipal purposes on all taxable property within the City limits of the City of Flagler Beach, Florida, for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2025 and ending September 30, 2026 and

WHEREAS, Florida law requires said ordinance or resolution to state the millage rate to be levied, and also, to state the percentage by which the millage rate to be levied exceeds the rolled-back rate as computed pursuant to Florida law; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Flagler Beach, Florida, has duly considered the budgetary requirements of the City; has adopted a tentative budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2025 and ending September 30, 2026 based on a millage rate of **5.4500 mills for Flagler County and 5.4500 mills for Volusia County** on the taxable property within the City; and has acted in accordance with the terms, provisions, and procedures contained in Section 200.065, Florida Statutes;

WHEREAS, the gross taxable value for operating purposes not exempt from taxation within Flagler County has been certified by the Flagler County Property Appraiser to the City of Flagler Beach as \$1,280,242,997. The gross taxable value for operating purposes not exempt from taxation within Volusia County has been certified by the Volusia County Property Appraiser to the City of Flagler Beach as \$15,539,546.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Commission of the City of Flagler Beach, Florida, in special session assembled, that:

SECTION 1. The ad valorem property tax millage rate for municipal purposes to be levied on the taxable property within the City limits of the City of Flagler Beach, Florida, during the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2025, and ending September 30, 2026, is hereby set at the rate of **5.4500 mills for Flagler County and 5.4500 mills for Volusia County**.

Resolution 2025-XX continued.

SECTION 2. The Fiscal Year 2025-2026 operating millage rate is **5.4500 mills**, which is greater than the rolled back rate of 5.1604 mills by 5.61% for Flagler County. The Fiscal Year 2025-26 operating millage rate is **5.4500 mills**, which is greater than the rolled back rate of 5.1604 mills by 5.61% for Volusia County.

SECTION 3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and adoption by the City Commission of the City of Flagler Beach, Florida.

Background:

Resolution 2025-76 establishes the City's official budget for October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026. It sets appropriations and funding levels for all City funds, including the General, Utility, Sanitation, Stormwater, CRA, Pier Enterprise, and Building Code Inspection Funds.

Exhibit A provides the FY26 budget summary of all funds, and exhibit B provides the changes to the budget since the proposed budget.

Fiscal Impact:

The adoption of this resolution authorizes expenditure of funds as outlined in the approved FY 2025-26 budget Summary (Exhibit "A").

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of Resolution 2025-76 adopting the Fiscal Year 2025-26 budget.

RESOLUTION 2025-76

A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FLAGLER BEACH, FLORIDA, ADOPTING BUDGETS FOR THE GENERAL FUND, UTILITY FUND, SANITATION FUND, STORMWATER FUND, CRA FUND, PIER ENTERPRISE FUND, AND BUILDING CODE INSPECTION FUND FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2025-26 FIXING APPROPRIATIONS THEREIN; PROPOSING EXPENDITURES THERE UNDER; AND DETERMINING THE AMOUNT OF MONEY TO BE RAISED BY TAXATION AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FLAGLER BEACH, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. - Section 2. All Resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.
- Section 3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and adoption by the City Commission of the City of Flagler Beach, Florida.
